Recent Prosecutions and Convictions - USA

July 9, 2018

JACKSONVILLE, FL – The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has cited North Florida Shipyards Inc., a shipbuilding and repair company, after an employee suffered fatal injuries at its Commodores Point facility in Jacksonville, Florida. The shipyard faces \$271,061 in proposed penalties. Read More

July 5, 2018

GENOA, IL – The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has cited Cleary Pallet Sales Inc., a Genoa, Illinois-based pallet manufacturer, after 10 employees required emergency medical treatment for carbon monoxide exposure. The company faces proposed penalties totaling \$216,253.

July 3, 2018

MIAMI, FL – The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has cited Bakery Management Corp., doing business as Bakery Corp., for exposing employees to caught-in, fall, and electrical hazards. The Miami-based commercial bakery faces proposed penalties of \$67,261. Read More

July 2, 2018

HURRICANE, WV - The U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has cited Design Roofing LLC for exposing employees to fall and other safety hazards at residential construction sites in Scott Depot and Culloden, West Virginia. The company faces proposed penalties of \$101,988. Read More

Recent Prosecutions and Convictions - Australia

16 July 2018

Victoria - The offender failed to eliminate or minimise, so far as reasonably practicable, the risk of powered mobile plant colliding with pedestrians. The offender pleaded guilty and was, without conviction, sentenced to pay a fine of \$20,000 and ordered to pay costs of \$4,115 ...Read More

11 July 2018

Victoria – The investigation established that employer had failed to conduct risk assessments at the workplace and failed to liaise with the host employer regarding risks arising from work related activities performed at the workplace. The matter resolved by way of an Enforceable Undertaking...Read More

10 July 2018

Victoria –The offender failed to ensure that guarding was as difficult as reasonably possible to bypass or disable. The offender pleaded guilty and was, without conviction, sentenced to pay a fine of \$20,000 and ordered to pay costs of \$2,586. ...Read More

6 July 2018

Queensland - On 6 July 2018, the defendant pleaded guilty in the Maroochydore Magistrates Court to breaching s.32 of the *Work Health and Safety Act 2011*, having failed to meet its work health and safety duties and was sentenced.

Magistrate Madsen fined the defendant \$50,000 and ordered professional and court costs totalling \$1092.55...Read More

4 July 2018

Victoria – The issues with the tractor exposed employees carrying out the task of collecting grapes in harvesting season to a risk of death or serious injury as a result of being crushed by the tractor. The offender pleaded guilty to two charges and was without conviction sentenced to pay a fine of \$40,000 and to pay costs of \$4115. ...Read More

4 July 2018

Victoria – The Front-End Loader (FEL) was in an unsafe condition. These faults placed the FEL operator at risk of being run over when starting the engine and at risk of injury when climbing in and out of the FEL. The offender pleaded guilty and was with conviction sentenced to pay a fine of \$230,000. ...Read More

4 July 2018

Western Australia – The Accused failed to, so far as practicable, provide and maintain a working environment in which persons employed or engaged by the contractor to carry out or assist in carrying out work for the Accused, were not exposed to hazards, being matters over which the Accused had the capacity to exercise control. The Accused entered a guilty plea and was convicted on 16 May 2018. On 20 May 2018 the Magistrate fined the Accused \$45,000 and ordered costs of \$2900.00. ...Read More

22 June 2018

New South Wales –After a SafeWork NSW investigation the defendant, was charged with a breach of section 32 / 19(1) of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011. On 22 June 2018, the defendant was convicted by the District Court and fined \$45,000. ...<u>Read More</u>
